SCHOOL-BASED SERVICES FOR CHILDREN & FAMILIES

School-Based Services

For many children and families, especially in rural areas, transportation can be a challenge. So TCMHS goes to them, offering services right at the school. We offer individual and family counseling and group treatment. As always, confidentiality is a priority.

The framework for our work is trauma sensitive and strength based. Individual assessments and treatment plans are created specific to the child and family.

Eligibility:

Children birth through age 20 who are:

- Experiencing emotional, behavioral, and/or social difficulties.
- Diagnosed with autism, mental retardation, or developmental delays.

Length:

Individual or family sessions are usually hourly sessions once a week and length of treatment is based on treatment goals. Services can be either short term in length or longer.

How to Contact Us

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Fees:

We accept MaineCare and some private insurances on a limited basis, as well as self-payments. In some districts, alternate funding is available for children without insurance.

During summer months, services are provided in schools or at one of our many locations to maintain continuity of care.
