“The Rehearsal” Wins Best Maine Film

Shows the power of art and performance in recovery

LEWISTON, ME- The documentary film “The Rehearsal” was recognized with one of the top awards in Saturday’s Lewiston/Auburn Film Festival. The short documentary tells the stories of people who have received mental health treatment at Tri-county Mental Health Services and their journeys onto the stage of Inspired Voices and toward recovery. Inspired Voices is a benefit event for the agency, with its sixth annual performance scheduled for June 25, 2011.

Craig Saddleire, the Lewiston-based filmmaker who directed “The Rehearsal” was presented with the MPBN Director’s Award Saturday evening. *“I think the positive response the movie is receiving only speaks to the power of the stories that the consumers are telling. People are being inspired by their courage and how they use performance in their recovery process. I want to give my personal appreciation to each of them and give them credit for their contributions to the movie...they earned this,” he said.*

The film was one of more 100 from all over the world screened in 10+ venues in the twin cities at the first ever LA Film Fest. Event organizer Josh Shea, Editor of L/A Magazine, introduced The Rehearsal, which opened the festival. *“We watched more than 180 films submitted to the festival, and this one was the only one that made me cry,”* he said, adding that it is a tribute to the work that TCMHS and its staff do every day to give hope.
