We sponsor three federally subsidized apartment buildings that were developed with US-HUD funding. These buildings offer safe affordable housing to people with severe mental illness. They are:

Our Mission

At TCMHS Community Housing, our mission is to provide community-based housing and related services to people in need of housing supports or residential treatment in Androscoggin, Oxford, Franklin, and Northern Cumberland Counties. Our goal is to assist people to enhance their success in the community, while emphasizing individualized programming and supports.

Roles, Relationships and Responsibilities

Community Housing:

- Offers a variety of housing opportunities.
- Advocates for housing for individuals with special needs in collaboration with other community providers.
- Works with other providers of housing on local and regional issues.
- Provides in-service training and education for other providers.
- Can provide clinical consultation to other community agencies in helping individuals with major mental illness.
- Participates in policy and program initiatives at the local and state levels.

Housing Programs

306 Pine Street, Lewiston

Located in a residential area of Lewiston, 306 Pine Street opened in 1990. Its mission is to provide housing and treatment for people with mental illness and a long history of hospital stays and who need help returning to the community. Residents live successfully in the community with the support of TCMHS staff. Each of the five residents is offered individualized treatment and support. They participate in a variety of activities, including rehabilitative services, supported employment, sports, and cultural events.

125 Franklin Street, Rumford

Home to five people, the beautiful Victorian house at 125 Franklin Street opened in 1996. The residence provides community-based, long-term housing and treatment for people with mental illness and a long history of hospital stays. At Franklin Street, consumer independence is emphasized, and residents participate in outside activities, such as school, work, social clubs, and recreational programs.

15 Village Street, Lisbon

Home to seven individuals living in their own efficiency or one-bedroom apartments, Village Street provides housing, treatment, and independent living supports to people with mental illness and a long history of hospital stays. Someone is available 24-hours a day, to give support, assistance and individualized treatment. While moving towards more independence, people living at the Lisbon House work on vocational training, life skills and education goals.

46 Kelly Drive, Sabattus

Kelly Drive is a supportive residential setting housing six individuals who struggle with major psychiatric illnesses and chronic medical conditions. The home offers the six individuals privacy, generous living space, and a large yard and porch to best enjoy the beautiful rural setting. People living at Kelly Drive work toward their self-determined goals with support and assistance from staff who are available 24 hours a day. The residents and staff work together to promote an atmosphere of recovery and hope.

Community Rehabilitation Services (CRS)

This new program offers individuals diagnosed with a serious and persistent mental illness, co-occurring mental illness and substance abuse, a range of services to support recovery and independent living in the community. The professional team offers skills development, coaching, support and assistance with symptom management. We help participants develop their own support networks, enhancing their ability to live independently.

Who is Eligible for CRS?

Services are available to adults diagnosed with a serious and persistent mental illness living in Androscoggin County and nearby communities. It is for people who can benefit from intensive services. This is a good post-residential option for people.
